



Child Pornography and Artificial Intelligence, Part 2

Artificial intelligence, or AI, has opened the door to generating incredibly realistic images. Often called "deepfakes," we have seen these images crop up on social media. In January 2024, explicit images of Taylor Swift, created by AI, were posted online, and viewed over 45 million times before they were removed. In the same way, AI technology can be used by child abusers to create and share explicit imagery.

Season of Advent

Advent begins this year on Sunday, December 1st. Most Catholics, even those who don't often go to Mass, know that Advent often involves a wreath with candles, possibly a "calendar" of hidden chocolates, pulling out of storage and untangling strings of Christmas lights and starting to make plans for Christmas. But Advent is much more than that. Here are a few thoughts on Advent.

The people of Israel waited for generations for the promised Messiah to arrive. Their poetry, their songs and stories and their religious worship focused on an awaited Savior who would come to them to set them free from captivity and to lead them to the fulfillment of all that God had promised.

Israel longed for a Messiah and John the Baptist, who came before Jesus, promised that the Messiah was coming and then pointed out and identified Jesus as "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world".

Advent is a season in the Church's life intended to renew the experience of waiting and longing for the Messiah. Though Christ has already come into the world, the Church invites us to renew our desire for the Lord, the Lord Jesus who was born to us in Bethlehem, the Lord Jesus who is with us now and who enters our lives in Holy Communion and the Lord Jesus who will have a triumphant second coming into the world.

During Advent, we're invited to enter more frequently into silence, into prayer and reflection, into Scripture, and into the sacramental life of the Church — all to prepare for celebrating Christmas.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says the goal of Advent is to make present for ourselves and our families the "ancient expectancy of the Messiah ... by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming."

Monday, December 9, 2024

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception - Holy Day of Obligation

Sunday, December 8, 2024 is the Second Sunday of Advent, so the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (our national patronal feast day) is transferred to Monday, December 9th.

Because the Sundays of Advent outrank solemnities on the Table of Liturgical Days, all Masses on December 8th will be those of the Second Sunday of Advent.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception will be celebrated on Monday, December 9th and celebrated as a holy day of obligation. **Masses on December 9th will be at 8:15 am, 12:05 noon-time and 7:00 pm.**

Rosary Procession led by Men of Exodus 90 Saturday, December 7th Vigil of Immaculate Conception Pearl Harbor Day

The men of Exodus 90 are leading a Rosary Procession on Saturday, December 7th after the 8:15 AM Mass. All our welcome to join. We are specifically making an appeal to the men of the parish to join us. We encourage all men to pray with us in this procession as a show of faith in a culture that has increasingly drifted away and has become more hostile to people of faith.

Exodus 90 assists men to be uncommonly free.

"For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." (Galatians 5:1)

It is normal for men to be distracted, addicted, and enslaved by so many things today. Alcohol. Pornography. Social media. Sports. Gambling. Work. Comparison. Achievement. Wealth. Legacy. It is so normal, in fact, that society's stereotypes of men are often associated with the very idols that plague them.

What is uncommon in our time is men who are free. A free man is not a perfect man but one who remembers who he is: A son of God whom God has called forth for love. And the free man knows how much more he can become by the power of grace unfolding in his life over time.

Through contemplative prayer, men open up to a vulnerable relationship with God. Through asceticism, men grow in the power to say "no" to the common things of the world that hold them back. Through fraternity, men have the essential support, encouragement, and mercy of other men striving after the same uncommon ideals.

The freedom of the uncommon man, the Exodus man, is not for its own sake. The world defines freedom as the ability to do whatever you want, whenever you want, with whomever you want. True freedom is for commitment, sacrifice, and love. Like Jesus on the Cross, the free man takes up his life and then lays it down for others. What is returned to him is a life of meaning, integration, and eternal satisfaction.

It is for this reason that God brought forth Exodus to serve men today.

Many elder religious worked for years for little to no pay, leaving a large gap in retirement savings. At the same time, fewer religious are able to serve in compensated ministry.

Like many Americans, religious communities face the monumental challenge of funding elder-care.

Today, retired religious outnumber wage-earners by nearly three to one.

Your donation makes a difference. Approximately 95% of the funds collected aids senior religious. Only 5% is used for administration and promotional activities.

"Those serving in religious life receive minimal compensation because of their vow of poverty, so donors giving to the retirement fund show appreciation for their work and provide them with a sense of security in their old age. We are so grateful for all they have done for us,' emphasizes Brother Charles Douglas, SSJ, 88, who has dedicated his life to religious service.

"Thank you for thinking about us! Your support acknowledges that we are the hands and feet of people, continuing the mission of Christ even in our retirement. Your generosity has been instrumental in helping others, and we are grateful for your recognition of our ongoing service. Together, we make a meaningful difference in the lives of those we touch. "In the past, we who served in religious life traditionally received minimal compensation because of our vow of poverty. Therefore, when donors contribute to the retirement fund, it not only shows appreciation for our work as men and women religious but also provides us with a sense of security in our old age," says Father James Day, 77, a member of the Trinitarians in Sykesville, MD.

"It is important to support our elderly sisters, brothers and religious order priests who have dedicated their lives to serving others."

All are invited to these annual celebrations honoring Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Faithful, including Aztec dancers, Mexican Equestrian Troupes and Guadalupano Groups from parishes throughout the Archdiocese, will gather on **December 1**st in East Los Angeles for the procession beginning at 10:30 AM at Our Lady of Solitude Parish (4561 E. Cesar Chavez) and continue for one mile along Cesar Chavez Ave., to the East Los Angeles College Stadium for Holy Mass at 1:00 PM. On **December 11th, the Annual "Las Mañanitas"** celebration at the Cathedral will begin at 6:00 PM with indigenous dancers and free seasonal treats on the Cathedral Plaza, and veneration of the Relic of the Tilma of St. Juan Diego, on which the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared 493 years ago.

The Cathedral is home to the only Relic of the Tilma outside of the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. At 10:00 PM, the celebration continues inside the Cathedral with a special Rosary with the participation of local talents. The musical tribute, or serenata, begins at 11:00 PM, with guest singers invited to serenade the Virgin Mary and sing "Las Mañanitas," a traditional Mexican birthday song to honor the Virgin Mary on Her Feast Day. The program will be in Spanish and the festivities will culminate with mid-night Mass in Spanish celebrated by Archbishop José H. Gomez.
